

## MEMBERSHIP/MENTORSHIP COMMITTEE Terms of Reference

Reports to: Alberta Chamber Executives Board

Objective: To strengthen the ACE organization by increasing and

retaining membership and to provide Chambers a resource tool to identify sources of potential information through

experienced Chamber staff.

Responsibilities:

• To welcome new Chamber Executives to their position, and advise the ACE membership of their presence.

 To identify and solicit memberships of those who currently do not have membership in ACE and provide them with the necessary information to aid in a decision to join.

• To work with a group of Chamber Executives from across the Province who wish to act as Mentors to their colleagues.

 To assign a Mentor to each new Chamber Executive to help them learn, and teach or advise them about ACE, ACC and Chamber operations and resources. The province will be divided into 4 regions and a mentor from each region will make the "first call" to new staff and see what information they need.

To liaise with other Committees to ensure that ACE operates in an environment of collaboration.

Meeting Frequency: As often as might be required via email or phone

Committee Members: Chair and two members at large for committee to include at

least 4 mentors

\* Mentors do not have to be members of the Membership

Committee to become involved as a mentor
